

ACCOUNTS OF MEETINGS

6 January 2010 President C.A. Stillions presiding, 21 members, 3 guests attending. President C.A. Stillions introduced visitor Pierce Bolan. He collects worldwide and was looking to merge some of his collections. He visited the club to see if anyone would like to purchase material from various countries, especially Poland. Mr. Bolan completed a WSCC application form and was ratified by majority vote. Member Gerry Marandino notified the club that a potential member, Vikram Raghavan, needed to be ratified. Vikram was ratified as a member by a majority vote. Vice President Don Petersen notified the club that Member Gerhard Wolff recently suffered a mild stroke. Don spoke with him and that he is a little slower and a little slurred, but joked that he is still collecting Bolivian Zeppelins. Don was passing a card around for members to sign. Vice President Don Petersen informed the club that the Stamps for a Living program is moving buildings and they are holding a "liquidation" sale. The club is meeting at 9:45 am February 25th for a visit and that he needs names of members interested in participating. Member Jill Piazza informed the club that Dr. Catherine Golden is speaking National Postal Museum on Sunday, January 10, 2010 at 1pm. Dr. Golden's lecture, Only a Penny: The Victorian Revolution, details the introduction of stamps into the English postal system.

President C.A. Stillions introduced the night's featured debate on the Proxy Voting Amendment. Member Daniel Piazza read the motion created at the Wednesday, November 23rd meeting and mailed shortly after to all members. President Stillions noted that the *Despatch* editors sent out a modified version, at his request, indicating the mailed statement needed additional modification. President C.A. Stillions fielded questions and responses throughout the debate. Discussion followed. Member Bruce Kellogg recommended that the language which says "notify the Executive Secretary and the Recording Secretary" be changed to read "Executive Secretary or the Recording Secretary." Member Matt Cassetta stated that he is a Life Member and is frequently out of the country and is looking for ways to stay involved with the club and its organization. President C.A. Stillions stated that he felt the amendment would prove a long-run detriment to the club by creating a loop hole for members to participate from a distance for meetings featuring serious club business. Member Jeff Meade stated that membership in a club entails the benefit of participation, regardless of circumstance. Club officers have a duty as elected officers to ensure that members have the ability to voice concern and see that their ideas are relevant and acted on. The vote passed with 18 YES, 2 NO, 1 ABSTAIN. President C.A. Stillions ratified the vote, effective January 6th, 2010.

Nominations for WSCC Officers for 2010 were made: **President: C.A. Stillions**, **Vice President: John Hardies**, **Executive Secretary: Jill Piazza**, **Recording Secretary: Jeff Meade**, **Treasurer: Bruce Kellogg**.

<u>20 January 2010</u> President C.A. Stillions presiding. 18 members and 2 guests attending. President C.A. Stillions introduced visitors **Andrea** and **Veronica**, from La Paz, Bolivia. The ladies came to the WSCC to find out more about their grandfather's collection, a man whose collecting founded the Bolivian National Collection. **Andrea and Veronica** are interested in learning more about stamp collecting. **Member Virginia Randolph** notified the club that APS is imposing a 5% fee on APS circuit sales. The circuits distributed by the WSCC cost around \$10 to circulate, and club members voted to stop circulating the books based on the new APS fee. The decision to drop the APS circuits will take effect on February 1st, 2010. **Vice President Don Petersen**

informed the club that the *Stamps for a Living* program is moving buildings and they are holding a "liquidation" sale. The club is meeting at 9:45 am February 25th for a visit and that he needs names of members interested in participating no later than February 18th. **President C.A. Stillions** introduced the night's featured event: the annual vote for club officers. No additional nominations were submitted, so the slate nominated on 6 January was ratified by acclamation.

<u>3 February 2010</u> President C.A. Stillions presiding, 18 members attending. President C.A. Stillions noted that the club still needs editors for the *Despatch*. He also noted that **Gerry Marandino** has agreed to volunteer to organize the Annual Member Dinner. President C.A. Stillions provided the club with updates on upcoming events: Annual Sundman lecture at the National Postal Museum; Fairfax stamp show on February 6/7; Member Auction on February 17. The event for this meeting was the Annual Herbert Cover Contest, which was won by **President C. A. Stillions**. Second place went to **Daniel Piazza**.

17 February 2010 President C.A. Stillions presiding, 18 members attending. President C.A. Stillions asked if any members attended the recent First Day Ceremony for the new Navy stamps. Member Virginia Randolph mentioned that her friend attended the ceremony at Ft. McNair and said a busload of New Yorkers showed up even in the snow and that the event was fairly well attended. President C.A. Stillions notified club members that the new Vice President, John Hardies, will be heading up a new committee to review and update the Bylaws and Constitution, including evaluating the club's status as a 501(c)3 in accordance with Washington DC regulations. Executive Secretary Jill Piazza thanked club members who responded to the email request for updating member contact information. She also asked that members check their names on a spreadsheet she brought that indicated those who responded and those who had not. The spreadsheet included a new category, "collecting areas," and she asked that all members check and make sure that information is correct as well. President C.A. Stillions introduced the program for the evening which was an auction with proceeds going to the members.
