MEMBER WILSON HULME DIES UNEXPECTLY



National Postal Museum's Curator of Philately and Washington Stamp Collectors Club member, W. Wilson Hulme, died suddenly while on a business trip to Florida in January.

In August 2002, Wilson Hulme began his work as Curator of Philately at the Smithsonian's National Postal Museum with a clear vision--the museum would be the center of the philatelic universe. From that day forward, Hulme worked with unwavering determination toward realizing that vision.

Hulme wanted the National Postal Museum to be a place where philatelists could "access the inaccessible". Under Hulme's leadership the NPM offered collectors unprecedented opportunities to see extraordinary philatelic rarities. Hulme was instrumental in bringing exhibits like "The Queen's Own: Stamps That Changed the World," an exhibition of materials from Queen Elizabeth's own Royal Philatelic Collection; "Stamps Take Flight," featuring materials from the USPS's Postmaster General's Collection; and "Rarity Revealed: The Benjamin K. Miller Collection," featuring materials from the Benjamin K. Miller Collection on loan from the New York Public Library.

"Wilson Hulme was a world-class philatelist who loved stamps, the hobby, the National Postal Museum and the people involved with the hobby. When Wilson was named curator, he said it was his dream job. SEYMOUR B. STISS ("Sy") From the former WPS, where he was their Newsletter editor for 25 years "B. CA" (Before C. A. Stillions), comes Sy Stiss to our newly-formed WSCC. He brings with him a history that will bowl you over! Hailing from his hometown Chicago, IL, Sy came to the DC Metro area in 1953. Before that, Sy had seen action as a soldier in the Italian Campaign of WWII. Stateside again after the war, civilian Stiss with the assistance of the G. I. Bill, attended the University of Illinois at Champaign-Urbana, where he earned a B.S. in History, thence "se-tenanting" to a Master's in Education. There was followed by a three year stint of teaching in Bloomington, IL, 50 miles to the west of his alma mater. After his move East in 1953, Sy eventually became a teacher, as well as the Supervisor of the Social Studies Division of the Arlington County Schools.

Sy's initial interest in philately was sparked by a album he received as a Christmas givt at about the age of 10, but he really "got-the-bug" about 1950, focusing in on Chicago and Illinois postal history. His ongoing collecting interests include Cameo Advertising Covers of the 1850's-1860's era, covers with two or more countries' stamps on them, and envelopes showing unusual supplementary markings.

Additionally, Sy loves classical music! You may chance to meet him at the Kennedy Center (as I did) preceding an NSO concert, or perhaps at the site of an Alexandria Symphony Orchestra concert, at a Friday Morning Music Club (FMMC) event.


